REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Attendance Regulations:

Students must enter the class rooms at the stroke of the first bell at 09:40 am. and settle down. They are obligated to create a conducive atmosphere for teaching and learning in the classrooms.

- Students must strictly follow their class schedule, i.e., they ought to be present for all the lectures, lab and library work, etc, if applicable
- Attendance is taken before the commencement of instruction, i.e., at the beginning of every hour
- Absentees must submit the leave application form with reasons for their absence, counter-signed by the parent/local guardian to the class teachers
- Continuous absence for 10 days without valid reasons, and proof, will lead to the removal of the students name from the attendance roll
- Students are permitted to appear for the end semester evaluation only if they have secured not less than 75% attendance in that subject during the semester
- A student on medical leave must produce the medical certificate along with the leave application duly signed by the parent/guardian when he/she re-joins the class
- Students are strictly forbidden from bunking classes

- Coming late to Classes is a source of disturbance both to the teacher and the class, especially when it becomes frequent. Students are, therefore, instructed to avoid coming late
- Condonation of the shortage of attendance for a maximum period of 12 days during a semester, and a maximum of two times during the entire degree program may be granted by the university
- Benefit of the condonation of attendance may be granted to those students who attend the approved activities of the college/university with the concurrence of the principal
- A student who is not eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance shall be permitted to repeat the course of study, if all other criteria are met

DRESS CODE FOR STUDENTS:

An ideal dress code is initiated by the college to the students for their active participation and learning process.

BOYS:

Boys should come to college wearing decent, clean shirts and full trousers. They are not allowed to wear printed T- Shirts, T- Shirts with gaudy colors. Wearing ear studs and forehand rings are also not allowed to maintain decorum among them.

They should not wear same coloured shorts, keeping beards and moustaches and bleach or colour the hair. If so, students have to face the strict disciplinary action.

GIRLS:

Girls should only wear chudidhars to the college. They are advised not to wear sarees, half sarees, skirts, jeans and any other type of tight outfitting of transparent dresses.

ETIQUETTES FOR HOSTEL STUDENTS:

- Strict adherence to the prescribed dress code is required. Decency in dressing & demeanor is a must
- Loitering in the hostel campus during the class hours will not be appreciated
- The management & staff will not be responsible for any of the personal belongings
- Late comers will be penalized
- Students must keep the campus & rooms, clean. Defacing walls, equipment, furniture etc., is strictly prohibited
- Birthday/other celebrations are strictly prohibited in hostel
- Students must turn off all the electrical equipments & lights before leaving their rooms
- Students are not allowed to use electric stoves, heaters etc. in rooms

- Students are not allowed to organize any group activities in their room
- Food will be served only in the designated Dining Hall(s) and only during the specified timings. Wasting food & water will not be encouraged
- All lights must be switched off before 11:00 PM in the rooms. Only study lamps are permitted
- Smoking, alcohol & narcotic consumption is prohibited in and around the hosted premises. Strict action will be taken against offenders
- Visitors are allowed only in the stipulated time. Visitors are not allowed beyond the visiting area. No outside Guest/Students will be allowed inside the hostel
- Students should not enter rooms of other students without permission
- Strict silence shall be observed in hostel. Care should be taken at all times to ensure that music/loud talking in NOT audible outside the room
- Students during their stay in the hostel will be governed by the management rules

ETIQUETTES FOR VALLUVAR FACULTY MEMBERS:

- The duty of faculty members does not end by completing the portions but by making efforts to devise new ways to motivate the students towards studies and career growth
- A faculty member must go to take lectures well prepared with practical examples and appropriate teaching aids. Usage of professional English as the medium of communication with the students is must
- A quality and high standard teaching is only possible when a faculty member is dedicated to the profession, students and the subject he/she is teaching
- General counseling of the students is required and is the responsibility of each faculty
- A polite and respectful way of communication with the students will help to maintain a good rapport between a faculty and a student. It can be in such a way that, "give respect to command respect"
- Expect during the lunch hours, a faculty member must avoid holding private meetings with other staff member/ faculty member
- A faculty member must follow law of the land and should not indulge him / her in an activity which can be detrimental to the reputation of the college

ROLES AND RESPONSIBLITIES OF FACULTY MEMBERS:

- Deliver lecture as much as possible in professional English
- Record of the poor performers (of previous semester) should be taken and those students be given considerably higher attention than normal students
- Answer sheets should not be evaluated on the basis of the general impression of the student in the class. Due – care need to be taken towards the quality of answers (including the language)
- reference, standard books can be encouraged by recommendation during discussion of topics in class and importance of standard books should be emphasized
- Ask and ensure the students to submit the assignments regularly.
- Encourage students to ask the question in English during interaction, discussion, viva-voice etc.
- It is mandatory for faculties to be on time to class and to inculcate high level professional etiquettes
- Mobile phones should not be flashed in classroom during teaching hours. It must be in silent mode
- If students are found using mobile in class hours then it must be confiscated and be sent to the discipline committee for appropriate action
- It is the collective responsibility of all the faculty members to intervene appropriately and counsel students for correctional

behavior and the use of language among students (the use of foul language will not be tolerated)

SCHOLARSHIP:

- The institution makes arrangements to provide scholarships released by private charitable trusts to all meritorious / below poverty line students
- Management also disburses scholarships to selected outstanding students in academics, sports and specific deserving students
- The College offers the Shri. P. Kaliyappa Gounder Memorial Scholarship for Economically weaker section students in the Academic year 2018 – 2019
- The College awards the Shri. L. Karuppaiyah Gounder Memorial Scholarship for meritorious students for all three years, based on the students 12th grade marks

community and by the community. It is a program for students to cater to the needs of the community, as and when required. The students joining this scheme develop many behavioral interactive skills. They visit the rural areas as NSS volunteers during the campus organized by the concerned colleges of departments of the university. The college has two NSS units under Bharathidasan University.

RED RIBBON CLUB (RRC):

The club aims at providing awareness about HIV and to promote voluntary blood donation among students. The club also facilitates in conducting activities to make the student community aware about AIDS and its psycho-social impacts. It strives to create more voluntary blood donors from the institution through committed activities.

YOUTH RED CROSS (YRC):

Youth Red Cross (YRC) provides opportunities for voluntary community service. The volunteers involve in first aid, disaster relief services, health and safety services, awareness programs, medical and community services, AIDS and its elimination.
